Vertical cable tray elbows at the top of runs should be supported at each end. At the bottom of runs, they should be supported at the top of the elbow and within 610 mm (24") of the lower extremity of the

GENERAL INFORMATION

Clamping a vertical cable to support it at intermediate points can reduce cable tensile loading. If clamping is not possible, a fiber optic mesh grip or fiber optic split mesh grip can be used at the top
